DONALD P. GREGG*President & Chairman*

Donald P. Gregg was named president and chairman of The Korea Society in 1993, following a 43-year career in the U.S. government which included serving as U.S. ambassador to Korea from 1989–1993. He earned his B.A. from Williams College after completing his service in the U.S. Army from 1945–47. In 1951, he joined the Central Intelligence Agency, and over the next 25 years was assigned to Japan, Burma, Vietnam and Korea. Seconded to the National Security Council staff in 1979, Ambassador Gregg was put in charge of intelligence activities and given responsibility for Asian policy affairs. In 1982, he retired from the CIA when then Vice President Bush asked him to become his National Security Advisor. Ambassador Gregg has received numerous honors and distinctions, including honorary doctorates from Sogang University in Korea and Green Mountain College in Vermont.

FREDRICK F. CARRIERE*Vice President & Executive Director*

Frederick F. Carriere lived and worked in Korea for over 20 years prior to assuming his current responsibilities with The Korea Society in 1994. During most of the years he spent in Korea, he was employed by the Fulbright program initially in the position of associate director and later as executive director from 1984–1993. Mr. Carriere also was a counselor of the Korea Branch of the Royal Asiatic Society for many years, and served as its president from 1989–91. In addition, he worked as a translator and editorial consultant for the Korean National Commission for UNESCO from 1977–80, and was an adjunct instructor teaching anthropology and Korean studies in the Far Eastern Division of the University of Maryland. Mr. Carriere holds an M.A. in Anthropology and Asian Studies from Cornell University, which he received after completing the course work for a Ph.D. in 1976.

YONG JIN CHOI*Director, Korea Studies Program*

Prior to joining The Korea Society, Yong Jin Choi was one of the founders of the Korean Studies Council International, Inc. In her previous and current positions, she has coordinated summer study opportunities in Korea for over 300 educators from across the U.S. Over the past thirteen years, Mrs. Choi has also implemented professional development programs for educators and directed the production of classroom curricula and teaching materials about Korea for major textbooks. She received the 2001 Franklin Buchanan Award from the Committee on Teaching About Asia of the Association for Asian Studies in recognition of the series "Korea: Lessons Grades K–12," which brings together information about Korean society in a form useful and interesting to both students and teachers. She holds a B.A. in history from Sogang University in Seoul and an M.A. in anthropology from the University of Hawaii. She has taught anthropology at Seoul National University.

SOPHIA H. KANG*Director, Development and Corporate Affairs*

Prior to joining The Korea Society in 1995, Sophia H. Kang headed the SK9 Group, Inc., a consulting firm specializing in bilingual and bicultural public relations, marketing and communications. From 1987 to 1994, Ms. Kang was deputy director of the Mayor's Office for Asian Affairs in New York City where she acted as a principal policy advisor to the administration on all Asian American issues as well as serving as New York City's chief representative and liaison to the Republic of Korea's business and political community. She organized and funded special community assistance programs, mayoral public-relations events, business seminars, and media forums. Ms. Kang is the recipient of numerous awards and distinction from various community and international organizations. She attended Ewha Woman's University, and received her B.E.A. from the Maryland Institute College of Art and her M.E.A. with distinction from the Pratt Institute Graduate School.
